These 3 opening sentences forever changed the world. The first is from the Magna Carta. The second is from the Declaration of Independence. The third is from the Constitution of the United States.

Arleta Day was our guest speaker on February 20, 2010. Arleta is a member of the Chemeketa Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution located in Salem. She gave a presentation on the Constitution of the United States and how some of the basic ideas contained in the Magna Carta flowed through the hope of a new government in Declaration of Independence and was delivered in the Constitution of the United States.

On September 17, 1787, the Constitution of the United States was signed by 39 delegates. In the 222 years since signing, there have been a total of 27 amendments. The 18th amendment was repealed by the 21st amendment.
