Grafting and Pruning Family Branches using DNA Genealogy Or

"One DNA test is worth 1,000 hours of Research"

Our own Compatriot David Devin discussed using DNA as a genealogy research tool. DNA can be a useful tool to help break through the "brick walls" that sometimes happen when doing genealogical research, but it's very critical to remember that DNA results do not identify a specific biological ancestor. Results are only valuable when compared to other test results.

There are a variety of laboratories that do genealogy DNA testing. The recommended laboratories are AABB and ISO certified.

There are a variety of DNA tests and all are designed to produce "markers" to aid in determining your ancestors.

Once you have selected and paid for the test, a sample kit is sent to you. To collect the samples is painless and requires you to use a cotton swab to collect the DNA samples. After you mail the collected samples back to the laboratory, the results will be mailed back after about 6-8 weeks. The results are normally in a table, and the results are compared with other tests to determine who potential matches are.
