Jul 7 - Engagement at Skenesborough NY. Jul 22 - Gen. Schuyler is forced by British Gen. Burgoyne's attack to abandon Fort Edward NY. Jul 7 - Sharp fight near Lake George between the Americans Jul 23 - British Gen.
