## Important August in 1777

1 Aug - Engagement at Essenecca Town SC.

2 Aug - Engagement at Dutch Island RI.

2 Aug - Engagement at Moses Kill NY.

3 Aug - Four British ships are sunk trying to pass Fort Washington in NY.

6 Aug - Gen. Herkimer is ambushed at Oriskany NY. The Indians scalp several Americans

6 Aug - We lose Fort Schuyler (Stanwix) NY.

11 Aug - Gen. Burgoyne heads for American supplies stored in Vermont.

12 Aug - Benedict Arnold volunteers to save Fort Schuyler in New York.

15 Aug - Seth Warner's Green Mountain Boys march alll night in a rain storm to join Stark at Bennington VT. They arrive in the nick of time.

16 Aug - The Battle of Bennington [VT] was really fought in New York state.

21 Aug - American raid from New Jersey into Staten Island

22 Aug - British Col. St. Leger's troops and his Indian allies are defeated at Ft. Stanwix (Rome, NY).

22 Aug - British raise the siege at Fort Schuyler NY.

24 Aug - Much of the Continental Army parades through Philadelphia on the way to counter Howe's invasion. Thay wear green sprigs (branches) in their hats. They probably acquired a number of the recently-authorized U.S. flags -- the "stars and stripes").

25 Aug - British Gen. Howe's troops land at Elk River MD.

28 Aug - Gen. Howe moves British forces up the Elk River into Maryland.
