## Compatriots:

It is the dog-days of August. I trust all of you are enjoying this beautiful weather. July was a busy month around my household as I am sure it was at yours. SAR and Republic Chapter sponsored events included the Veterans weekend at the Volcanoes Stadium on July 2 & 3. Compatriot Johnny Alexander and I were there, along with the Lewis & Clark Chapter, to promote the Sons of the American Revolution. On July 4th, Compatriot Johnny Alexander was master of Ceremony for the Sounds of Liberty celebration at the Oregon Capital building. Compatriot Wight and myself were there. July 30th was the Oregon Society's Board of Managers meeting in Eugene. Just last weekend (Aug. 6th), the CAR/DAR/SAR Annual Picnic at Tigard. My family and I represented the Republic Chapter.

Perhaps you noticed for the events I listed above, we had just a couple of Compatriots from the Republic Chapter membership participating. If every current member sponsors just one new member in the next year, we would double our membership.

In addition, it is not just the Republic Chapter or the Oregon Society SAR for which we need to promote membership. The Oregon Society for the Children of the American Revolution is always looking for members. For example, all members of the Lausanne Society CAR (the Salem CAR society) come from just three families. Do you have nieces, nephews, or grandchildren who might like to join? Maybe, they just need a little "push" in that direction. Members of the CAR tend to become members of the DAR and SAR.

Occasionally, a fellow Compatriot shares how people ask about the SAR because of a bumper sticker on their car or a decal on a window. How many of you regularly wear your rosette to show that you are a member of the SAR? The Rotary Club and other service organization members proudly wear their pins. One of the reasons they wear pins is to give people the opportunity to ask what the pin is for. A simple question can lead to a new member.

## Important August dates in 1778

Aug 5 - French Admiral d'Estaing arrives at Newport RI with the French fleet.

Aug 6 - French Minister presented to Congress.

Aug 10 - A British fleet of 34 sail appear before Newport RI. The French fleet comes out and gives chase. The English get away without a fight.

Aug 13 - Gen. Cornwallis takes command of British forces in Yorktown VA.

Aug 20 - French Admiral d'Estaing brings the French fleet into Narraganset Bay (south of MA).

Aug 28 - Gen. Sullivan is forced by the British to turn back to RI.

Aug 28 - French Admiral D'Estaing's fleet arrives in Boston.

Aug 29 - Engagement at Butts Hill RI.

Aug 31 - Engagement at Indian Field and Bridge NY.



### Rhode Island between 1776 - 1778

The British occupied Newport in December 1776, and a long siege to evict them culminated in August 1778 in the large but inconclusive Battle of Rhode Island, a contest which was the first combined effort of the Americans and their French allies. The British voluntarily evacuated Newport in October 1779, but in July 1780 the French army under Rochambeau landed there and made the port town its base of operations. It was from Newport, Providence, and other Rhode Island encampments that the French began their march to Yorktown in 1781.
